The FCC focuses on helping patients with major depressive disorder (MDD), a \$75 billion market. In the United States, an estimated 17 million people suffer from MDD, which accounts for 7 percent of the population. Outpatient mental health is a large but inadequate market with an addressable market that is three times that of the substance abuse market and represents five times the current annual expenditure. Outpatient mental health is highly fragmented with only 5% of providers working as part of an expanded corporate body. COVID-19 has an even more negative impact on the mental health of 52% of people and individuals who feel symptoms of depression during the pandemic, compared to 25% before the pandemic. Tricare and commercials represent 70% and ~10% of the payer mix, respectively. Demand for private, military-focused outpatient mental health services will continue to increase as the Defense Health Administration (DHA) is obliged to shift active-duty families off-base to receive them. The FCC offers a full range of evidence-based therapies, including dosing and non-dosing solutions. Our psychotherapy interventions can be used in combination with medication or transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS) to best target a patient's treatment needs. The FCC has significant plans to expand its geographic footprint, therapeutic offerings, and payer mix through aggressive denovo and acquisition growth plans.
